Ranger Station Art Gallery 2021 Schedule

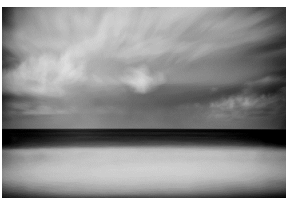
Greg Laxton Ekberg March 6 - 28

At multiple shorelines across Canada she has been creating fantastical lures that may attract resident lifeforms.

Barbara Shelley is a textile, fabric artist and colour theorist. In her abstract work, she evokes her surrounding landscape in Balcarra, BC. and in her representational work, she transcends the ephemeral beauty of our West Coast.
